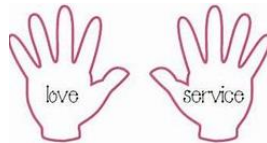
## Pastor's Ponderings

"Make us worthy, Lord, to serve our fellow *humans* throughout the world who live in poverty and hunger; give them through our hands this day their daily bread and by understanding love, give peace and joy."

*Mahatma Gandhi*

The disciplines of the followers of Jesus, who are part of the body of Christ, begin with acknowledging a relationship with Jesus and then recognizing the need to follow in a faithful way the calling Jesus set out for us. In the book *Real Faith for Real Life* by Michael Foss, we are introduced to some activities that happen in response to believing in Jesus. They include Prayer, Worship, Bible reading, Service to others, Nurturing relationships, and Giving. The author dives deeply into these subjects and empowers the reader to take up the mantle and grow in their relationship to God. The above quote from Mahatma Gandhi was on my mind when the mosque in New Zealand was attacked, when the cyclone hit Mozambique and other countries in South Africa and I hear the challenge of this quote thinking about the recovery process happening in areas where flooding (Nebraska), wind, (Florida Panhandle), and earthquakes happened. We are challenged to serve with what we have received from God.

Our food pantries, world hunger appeals, and seeing the big picture, that we are in the world's 1% of wealth, helps us to get in touch with the call to serve, which is integral to being a Christian. Michael Foss writes "that the call for justice in the Bible is so repetitive that we can become deaf to its drumbeat!"



I challenge all of us to hear the drumbeat and do what we are called to do as Christians in whatever little or big way we can. Remember, it starts with one step to go the distance.

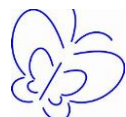

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### March Stewardship

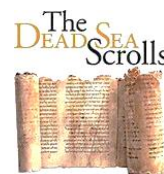

He also included prayers, Bible verses and a reading from Matthew 25.

TOL's topics of conversation focused on the following:

- how our views and thoughts of the elderly and those needing respite care have changed through life.
- relating a time when we encountered God in elderly populations or by serving them.
- the challenges and joys of serving them.
- thinking about how we, and the church, can make a difference in their lives.

The service closed with prayers of the people, the singing of "Change My Heart O God," and a blessing.

## Easter Words from Henry Vaughan

Unquestionably my favorite Christian poet is Henry Vaughan, who lived from 1622 to 1695, but whose poetry is very much alive today. He wrote on many subjects besides Easter, but I've tried to give you some of his words on that day of days in our spring.

But He that with His blood (a price too dear)  
My scores did pay  
Bid me, by virtue from Him, challenge here  
The brightest day

There above noise and danger  
Sweet Peace sits crowned with smiles,  
And One born in a manger  
Commands the beauteous files,  
He is thy gracious Friend,  
And (O my soul awake)  
Did in pure love descend  
To die here for thy sake...

He alone  
And none else can  
Bring bone to bone  
And rebuild man,  
And by his all subduing might  
Make clay ascend more quick than light.

Ah, my dear Lord! What couldst thou say  
In this impure, rebellious clay,  
That made thee thus resolve to die  
For those that kill thee every day?  
O what strange wonders could thee move  
To slight thy precious blood and breath!  
Sure it was Love, my Lord, for Love  
Is only stronger far than death.

I hope Vaughan's words may give an extra dimension to your Easter prayers.
