Pastor's Ponderings

"No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."

Matthew 5:15-16

Verse 15 is used in one of our favorite church Sunday School songs, "This Little Light of Mine"... 'Hide it under a bushel, NO!' Verse 16 is quoted in our baptismal liturgy, "Let your light shine before others..." The light we are not hiding but letting shine, is the light of Jesus. Jesus declares he "is the light of the world." This light becomes our light as we shine God's steadfast love into the world, as we use the gifts we have been given to further God's kingdom on earth, and as we practice a "grace-filled" life in a world that needs examples of this daily.



Letting our light shine means welcoming all our neighbors, not just ones who are like us. Putting our light on the lampstand means keeping a steady presence in the world, so that people might act ethically, unselfishly, and generously. The light we shine individually becomes brighter when we do this as a community. Serving, Loving, Welcoming, Forgiving, Hoping, Enduring, Empowering are examples of many words that emanate from being the light in the world, while exposing racism, sexism, and other corporate sins that keep us from being a community together.

As the Autumn season sends us less sunlight, let us make sure God's light does not diminish. Let your light shine!
